## Beresford Street Kitchen


The charity Beresford Street Kitchen is usually a busy café, meeting point and social hub in Jersey, that provides workplace opportunities for people with wide-ranging skills and life experiences. The charity set up a Pay it Forward scheme to support people during lockdown. To support the scheme, the Foundation donated £500 which will provide a further 100 meals for Jersey residents in need. The kitchen is also a social enterprise, so every penny made in sales goes back into the charity.
